Check which competitions you plan on entering

Cookies- 12/6/22
Bring 12 cookies to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on December 6, 2022 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Corn Bread - 1/10/23
Bring 12-2"x2" pieces of corn bread to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on January 10, 2023 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Soup - 2/7/23
Bring a container with around 12 servings of soup to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on February 7, 2023 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Carrot Cake - 3/7/23
Bring 12 servings of carrot cake to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on March 7, 2023 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Bread - 4/4/23
Bring 12 servings of your bread to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on April 4, 2023 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Meat Loaf - 5/9/23
Bring a loaf pan with enough for 12 small servings to the Tulsa Scott Pavilion at the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on May 9, 2023 between 4pm and 6:30pm.

Disposable dishes are best, but you can bring plates, pots and pans, just be sure to label them. You can pick them up at the Fair Office the following day.

The Best of Plumas is an exciting opportunity for bragging rights, and some swell prizes, for whoever has the best tasting cookies, corn bread, soup, carrot cake, bread and meat loaf. Why these? Because these are the food we hear most people claim that their's is the best. Sure there are other foods, but we'll get to them later.

About every month or so, a group of 6 average people will judge the different foods and create a score that will determine who has the "Best of" in Plumas County.

The event is sponsored by the PSCF Foundation, a non-profit established to support the Plumas Sierra County Fair, and Sav Mor Foods of Quincy, California.

JUDGING

Judges will be selected from throughout the County and asked to come to the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds on judging day. Judges will have no special skills or knowledge, they will judge each entry based on taste. Judges will give a score of 1 to 10, with 10 being the highest score. Entries will not be judged against each other; the score will be based on how much the judge likes that particular entry. Judges will have no knowledge of who they are evaluating. Some of the categories are broad, and exhibitors need to know that, for instance, zucchini bread may be up against sourdough bread. Judges are instructed to give unbiased scores, but if a judge really hates zucchini bread, they may give it a lower score. Conversely, the judge may find that it still tastes good for zucchini bread and give it a higher score. What happens in this competition will not end the war in Ukraine, we just want someone to be able to say they make the best bread in Plumas County...until the next competition.

If there is a tie, all judges will consider the tied entries and rank them against each other. All the judge's ranks will be totalled to declare a winner.

HOW TO ENTER

Competitors will submit a simple entry form with contact information, the name of their dish and any ingredients that may have allergy issues. The same entry form can be used for as many competitions as an exhibitor wishes to enter, but only one entry per exhibitor per competition will be allowed. Organizers will make sure the judges have no idea of any exhibitor's identity by using numbered, neutral dishes. On the day of judging, competitors will bring their entry to the Plumas Sierra County Fairgrounds between 4pm and 6:30pm. Judging will be closed to the public and the winner will be announced on Facebook after the results have been tabulated.

WHO CAN ENTER

Competitors must be a resident of Plumas County. Individuals or businesses can compete. There is no distinction between professional and amateur.

WHAT DO YOU WIN?

The winner of each competition will receive a beautiful "Best Of" rosette, a plaque commemorating their accomplishment and a \$100 gift certificate from Sav Mor Foods.

Competitors are encouraged to enter several different competitions. The cumulative score of all the competitions they enter will be combined to establish the "Best of the Best of the Best" Award. That person will receive a large trophy and a \$500 gift certificate from Sav More Food.

TIPS

Organizers want to make sure your entry is presented in it's best possible form. That means they will make sure that hot dishes are judged while they are hot. If you have a preference as to how anything else should be served; room temperature, refrigerated or warmed, put that information on the entry form. Visual presentation is not being judged, but every effort will be made to offer each entry as attractively as possible.
